Australians throw away about 7,150 recyclable plastic bags a minute or 429, 000 per hour!*

And this figure doesn't include the countless bread bags, frozen vegetable bags, pasta bags, biscuit packets and sachets consumers bring home from the supermarket every time they shop.

Plastic bags and packaging can't be collected by most local councils as part of their kerbside pickup. Instead, they typically end up in landfill or as litter, harming wildlife and the environment.

HOW IT WORKS

The REDcycle Program makes it easy for consumers to keep plastic bags and packaging out of landfill.

It works like this:



COLLECT!

Collect all the soft plastics that can't be recycled at home. Please ensure it is dry and as empty as possible

DROP!

Drop them into REDcycle Program drop off bins at participating supermarkets. Visit **redcycle.net.au** to find your nearest drop off point.

We'll recycle them into fitness circuits, sturdy outdoor furniture, bollards and other products.

Do the <u>SCRUNCH</u> test!

If the plastic CAN be scrunched up (into a ball), it can be placed in a REDcycle Program drop off bin. If it CAN'T be scrunched, it should be recycled at home via kerbside collection.

MORE THAN JUST PLASTIC SHOPPING BAGS! We collect:

- Bread bags
- Biscuit packets
- Frozen food bags
- Rice & pasta bags
- Confectionary packets

- Plastic film from grocery items
- Cereal box liners
- Old reusable bags
- Newspaper wrap

WHERE DOES THE PLASTIC PACKAGING GO?

The collected plastic is returned to RED Group's facility for initial processing then delivered to Australian manufacturer Replas where it undergoes an incredible transformation.

The resulting recycled-plastic products are extremely robust, as well as water and termite resistant. They won't crack, splinter or rot and will never need painting. Amazing!
